



# PHELPS-CLIFTON SPRINGS CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT 2020-2021 REOPENING PLAN

August 7, 2020

This sheet summarizes reopening plans for Midlakes Schools under guidelines provided by the New York State Department of Health, New York State Education Department, and Ontario County Public Health with input from district stakeholders. ## HYBRID INSTRUCTION

All students will receive instruction beginning Monday, Sept. 14 under a phased-in hybrid model that will bring those in UPK - Grade 3 to campus for in-person instruction first. Other grade levels will start the year on remote instruction.

The hybrid model places most students (UPK-12) into two cohorts or groups (placements have yet to be assigned):

- ▶ **Cohort A** will meet in-person on Mondays and Tuesdays with remote instruction on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- ▶ **Cohort B** will meet in-person on Thursdays and Fridays with remote instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays.
- ▶ **Also**, students are currently required to meet all state requirements and take assessments for advancement. Attendance will be taken when school is in session. Children in the same household will attend in-person on the same days and may ride the bus together.

## SPECIAL EDUCATION

All special education students assigned to 12:1:1 and 15:1:1 programs (grades K-12) will attend in-person instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Special education students in the consultant teacher direct or resource model will participate in the remote and/or hybrid models with their grade-level peers. ## ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

English Language Learners not in the above grade levels or groups (UPK-3 and 12:1:1/15:1:1 programs) will receive some in-person instruction (schedule to be determined).

## FULL REMOTE INSTRUCTION

Families may opt for full remote instruction based on medical condition with proper documentation. Every attempt will be made to support all other families opting for full remote instruction to the extent possible under available staffing. Students opting for full remote instruction without medical documentation must remain in full remote instruction for an entire trimester (grades K-6) or an entire quarter (grades 7-12).

## According to guidelines provided by the state, all schools must:



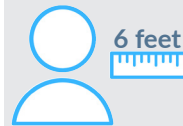
Ensure educational equity, access, opportunity, quality, and support
